Who is Ursula Kimball?

We have always been fascinated by names – Kimball names, of course. They have changed through the centuries since Richard and Ursula arrived -- even



names keep up with what is fashionable at the moment. We have become accustomed to the many Richards, and Henrys and Johns still arriving. What we have never solved is the mystery of Ursula Scott. Why was she given a Saint's name?

When she was born, about 1595, England was already a protestant country.

Henry VIII died about 1547, and his legacy was exactly what he wanted – a nation tied neither to Rome nor to continental reformers. Henry's England would be just that – English. It was not easy to reach that goal; there was dissent in his own family. He was succeeded on the throne by a boy King who was Protestant, and who also had two older sisters; one

Catholic and the other a pragmatist who would accept whatever worked the best. The young King Edward died, to be followed by the Catholic, and after Mary's bloody reign and too many deaths, by the greatest Tudor of all, Queen Elizabeth I.

She did not wear the crown easily; there was dissension, and in-fighting among her nobles. It was not until James (James I) followed her on the throne that the Book of Common Prayer was truly accepted: or, perhaps more truthfully, pushed along by King James' appointee as head of the Church of England, Archbishop of Canterbury, William Laud. There were many who never accepted the Church of England, and it has been said that Shakespeare himself was Catholic; as heretical, almost, as the other end of the spectrum – the Pilgrims and Puritans who settled Massachusetts, as far away as they could get from persecution, and still remain Englishmen. Given all this, why Ursula? There are no other Ursulas in the index done by Morrison and Sharples, nor have we found any Kimballs bearing that name.

UPDATE FROM MARCH NEWSLETTER

Nothing comes easily, it appears, when dealing with this family. The names of the children, when born; grandchildren – You name it, there's sure to be a problem.

We are certain there are mistakes in dates, in alliances and everything else included in this résumé. And that is partly why we are doing this. We would like, from any of you, involved genealogically with this family, to set us straight when we make a faux pas. We have question marks dancing before our eyes with every name we add to the total. The only sureties are Stephen and Hannah themselves. So, now we hope we are starting with the oldest child:

Kimballs..., Committee Update

We are late this month; you should be reading the June Newsletter. Our excuse is legitimate; we have been proofing the earlier chapters of Volume II. (Pagination requires starting at the beginning, of course.) And, we need to move forward, and in order to do that properly, work done needs to be checked for contents, spelling, order, personal 'reference' numbers, and so on, ad nauseam. It takes two people to proof, one to read aloud the contents and the other, with pen in hand, prepared to interrupt at mistakes, misspells, and so on. It is basically boring work; name after name, with most of the material repetitious – there are only so many different occupations available.

THE KIMBALLS' LIFE STORIES

And, as we are still at the beginning of this portion, places where these Kimballs moved – we are still in the nation-building period. We have been appalled at the numbers of children who never reach even their teenage years; and sometimes we are told what caused their deaths. We are also not surprised by the numbers of male Kimballs with multiple marriages – a wife dies in childbirth, and within a year she has been replaced. And, there are those who have 'gone west' into new territories as these open up in the Midwest. It is a period of expansion, and because we are now reading of these people we know there is war coming soon, and a way of life that will change because of that war. We read of the Revolutionary vets and how they found new lands and increased the country.

SOME "LOST" KIMBALLS ARE FOUND

Many of these short biographies are new materials, the results of members who sent queries of 'lost' Kimballs, and for some, months of painstaking queries and research both in Kittery and wherever the enquirer lived. Yes, we have found answers to many questions with the help of others, for which all of us engrossed in these searches are grateful. We also have Kimballs we have not yet placed on their way from the east to the west, and can only hope something will arrive someday with answers. One thing is a certainty, there is no easy answer, nor, in many instances, any answer at all – yet.

ADDING POETRY AND PROSE

We also can add that the introduction to Volume II is already written. Several years ago we decided a class on 'writing,' offered by the local adult education program was something we could use; it had been too many years since any practice or discipline had taken place, and we thoroughly enjoyed getting back to both poetry and prose. The class produced the introduction, as well as a bit of 'Kimball' verse. The introduction will wait, and the poetry I may share along the way. (The nicest part of these classes was the many differing backgrounds of the members in the classes, and the help from them and the instructor. We left the classes feeling more secure in our work and if another opportunity arises will probably do it again. Suggestions from our peers are always useful; we all have similar goals and need feed-back to keep our aging minds pliant.

KFA Education Scholarships

To assist young Kimball's in their pursuit of higher education in any form -- vocational, trade, or college -- the Judith Kimball Scholarship Fund Committee raises money with which annual scholarship(s) that are awarded at the reunion.

Funds permitting, the Association tries to award at least two \$500 scholarships each year. In 2009, we awarded five scholarships.

In addition to the scholarship money, the recipient of the award is also awarded a 5 year paid membership to the Kimball Family Association. Scholarship applicants are eligible to re-apply for scholarship funds in any year that they meet the Association requirements.

We raise monies for the Scholarships in several ways.

1. \$2.50 of annual dues is allocated to the Scholarship Fund.
 2. Monies raised by the auction/fund rising at the annual reunion.
 3. Donations made to fund by members and relatives of members.

HOW TO QUALIFY:

Scholarships are awarded only to individuals who have been dues paying members of KFA for at least three years, or dependent children or grandchildren of such members. Grandchildren must show genealogical relationship to member grandparent.

HOW TO APPLY:

In order to be considered for the scholarship each applicant must submit the

following:

1. Evidence of acceptance to a college or school of higher learning;
2. A copy of your recent high school/college transcript;
3. List of leadership experiences you have had in school/on the job/in the community
4. A written essay of 200 hundred words or less entitled -- "What it Means to Me To Be a Kimball."

SCOLARSHIP CRITERIA:

- Academic work completed
- Leadership at school
- Job and/or community service
- Your essay regarding your Kimball Heritage


