

## Richard Maloon Guest Speaker at Reunion

Richard Maloon has spent the past few summers knee deep in dirt, working to preserve and protect dozens of tombstones in Merrimack. Richard Maloon is 81. He is meticulously cleaning about 174 headstones and footstones at the historical Thornton Graveyard in Merrimack—a process that is not only time-consuming but rewarding and worthwhile, he said. Some of the stones date back to the 1750s. “I have been doing this off and on for maybe 10 years” says Richard. He is a former president of the New Hampshire Old Graveyard Association.

He with his volunteers are nearly finished with their work at the Thornton Graveyard. He previously cleaned about 400 headstones last summer at the Turkey Hill Cemetery as well.




# Scholarship Award Winners

## KFA RESOURCE BOOK



At the 2021 Reunion, we handed out 28 copies of the new KFA Resource Book. The contents of the 3-ring binder consists of "all things Kimball," according to a Board member. The book tells of the beginnings of the KFA and provides information on the immigrant Richard. The benefits of membership are described. A fledgling section, "Notable Kimballs," tells the stories of a few special Kimballs; more biographies will be added as we go forward. There are sections on developing your own "Notable Kimballs" and guides for research as well as storage of copies of the newsletter or special articles. A favorite section, "Location, Location, Location," list 43 pages of places named, "Kimball," across the nation reminding us of the depth and diversity of Kimballs.

We still have about 150 binders to compile and mail to those members who have paid their dues through at least December 2021; some members are paid for many more years! Although the costs of materials, copying, and mailing are being underwritten by a special, very generous donor, it has been suggested that members might want to acknowledge the uniqueness of the Resource Book and make a financial contribution toward those expenses. who I know want access and will get to everyone as quickly as I can. If you want access and have not yet been invited, please let me know. I will move you to the top of the list!




# SIR MARCUS RICHARD KIMBALL, BARON KIMBALL OF EASTON

Recently, a member sent me a picture and some additional information on a "Kimball" who was a Baron in England. Marcus Richard Kimball was knighted in 1981 and subsequently became "Baron Kimball of Easton" in 1985. I was impressed! However, I was also curious about who this guy could be. Over the years, my various readings had me believing that the "Kimball" name was adopted when we arrived in America. Our English ancestors had been "Kimbell." So who was this guy?

My research revealed that Baron Kimball of Easton is also a descendant of our Richard, the original immigrant! Shown below is his lineage.

As best I can tell, the family stayed in the Bradford & Boston areas for most of the generations. Thomas apparently removed to Ipswich with dad but moved to Hampton, NH, by 1653. Sometime after 1660, he moved to Rowley, MA (now Bradford). Most of the descendants followed suit to stay in that area. Marcus Morton Kimball went to Harvard, Class of 1866, as did his two sons, Lawrence & Day Kimball. Lawrence traveled extensively and is the one who ended up in England, dying in Salisbury, Wiltshire, England. His son Marcus Richard Kimball was born in Marylebone, London, England, so was a British citizen. I am not sure what he did to get to be a Baron, but there is a Wikipedia article on him that may explain it and provides a good picture of him. He has been added to our Ancestry.com tree. 


